Lunglei Govt. College, the oldest College in Southern Mizoram in its third cycle assessment and accreditation by NAAC in Dec, 2024 was awarded a prestigious status B+ Grade. LUNGLEI GOVERNMENT COLLEGE

Lunglei Govt. College, a premiere institution of higher learning of repute in Mizoram, was established in 1963 as Lunglei College by a group of social workers and public figures to cater to the need of the public in facilitating higher education in the state. Lunglei College became the first College to be established in the southern part of Mizoram and the second in the whole state. It was provincialised by the Govt.of Mizoram in the year 1976 and hence became Lunglei Govt. College

The College is situated in the picturesque town of Lunglei in Mizoram. Following its inception, the College was first affiliated to the then Gauhati University, which was then passed on to the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) in 1973. Permanent Affiliation of the College to NEHU since 1987 was passed on to Mizoram University in 2001. The goals and objectives of the College are to impart quality education and to facilitate all-round development of students on national perspectives. In line with its motto, 'Summa Supremo' - 'the utmost for the highest', the institution continuously strives for promotion of quality and excellence in higher education. The College emphasizes on providing equal opportunities to the students regardless of caste, creed or gender.

- To ensure quality education and produce employable, responsible and resourceful citizens.

CAMPUS INFORMATION

The College has a campus area of about 9 hectares with boundary wall and barbed wire boundary fencing.

1. BUILDING COMPLEX

The College Complex comprises of the Administrative Building, Arts Block, Science Block, Girls Hostel, Basketball cum Volleyball court, Canteen, a few staff quarters etc. The College has an independent Science Block for all the experimental subjects i.e. Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics, Geography & Geology. A new Auditorium is being constructed with modern facilities with a grant of Rs 519.50 lakhs.

2. LIBRARY

College have separated library building constructed from RUSA 02 funding at the cost of Rs 100 lakhs and vertical extension of Library Building also constructed from NEDP/SEDP fund accounting Rs.31 lakhs. The building was inaugurated by Honorable Minister Dr. R.Lalthangliana i/c HTE, Industries, etc on 15th March, 2021. Library is covered with CCTV surveillance. College Library has a rich stock of Books, Journals, Magazine and News Papers. A wide range of Encyclopedia and advanced Books of knowledge provide a ready reference to Library users. The Library provides Xerox facilities at concessional rate.

3. LABORATORIES

All the Six Science Departments and Dept of Geography have functional laboratories. The laboratories are equipped with sophisticated instruments to enable the students to carry out their practical at the honours level.

4. HOSTEL

A 50 (30+20) seaters, two girls' hostels and 20 seaters one boys' hostel caters to the residential needs of out-station students. Hostel admission notice will be issued a few days after the commencement of classes for the new session. Hostel seats are allotted on priority basis to students from interior villages.

 - HSSLC Overall marks of **55% and above** will be given direct admission, depending on the availability of seats
 - Admission for students securing less than 55% will be based on merit
- **Bachelor of Science**
 - Admssion will be based on first come first serve basis
- All admission and processing fees should be done through **Online mode Only**
- Consideration for those without any means of online payment methods will be allowed for offline payment of Admission fee during office hours
- Payment details are given on the college website, at **www.lgc.ac.in**
- Applicants seeking admission to the college are requested to check the **college website** for updates and changes regarding admission criteria
- For those seeking admission through sports quota, State Level Certificate must be produced
- Admissions are to be done through online mode only at **www.lgc.ac.in**

CODE OF CONDUCT

It is imperative for all students to note and abide by the following rules and regulations :

Classroom Attendance

The College strictly follows the guidelines laid by the UGC as regards students' classroom attendance. As per the UGC's instructions therefore, students are required to acquire at least a minimum of 75% attendance in theory and 90% in practical classes in each academic session. Students who do not meet the requirement shall not be allowed to fill up examination forms. Unexplained absence from class sessions and involvement in activities during lecture hours outside the classroom are unacceptable and may cause disciplinary action against the offending student.

Smoking, Alcohol and Drugs

Smoking, drinking alcohol and use of any other intoxicating substances is strictly prohibited in the College campus. Any student caught smoking, drinking, taking drugs or even found under the influence of intoxicants will face disciplinary action which may extend up to expulsion from the College.

Ragging

Ragging is considered a serious offence. Students are strictly forbidden from harassing their fellow students. If any activity of ragging is found, the College authority will take action against the culprits. Punishment for ragging may be even up to dismissal from College.

Socialising

Socialising within the College premises, outside the classroom is encouraged to the extent that students sit together to enliven the College atmosphere and learn new things from peer discussions. It is however strongly inadvisable to hangout at all times around the campus while neglecting classroom attendance.

Use of Mobile Phones

Students are not allowed to use Mobile phones inside the classroom. If at all they are carried into the classroom they must be switched off. Students are strictly prohibited to bring Mobile phones inside the examination hall.

Student Activities

In order to explore and develop the potentials of students, the College provides a stage by conducting various students' activities. These activities are deemed useful in building the personality of students. All students are therefore encouraged to actively participate in these programmes in whatever capacity they are capable of.



College T-Shirt

Students are expected to have the College T-shirt as it will be mandatory to wear them on certain occasions such as College Week, important College functions etc. Students representing the College in any activity must wear the College T Shirt. Students may also wear the College T Shirt on any day of the week to College. No student must be found smoking, drinking or intoxicated with any substance, or involved in any untoward behavior while wearing the College T shirt. Violation of this rule may lead to disciplinary action which may amount to expulsion.

Campus Security and Maintenance

It is regarded as the responsibility of all the students to protect and maintain the security of the College properties, facilities and the campus. The College strives to uphold cleanliness as it is considered a prerequisite to a wholesome working and learning environment. Reckless littering and destructive behavior will be regarded as a disrespect of the College and will not be tolerated.



EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. Student Union

All students are members of the Student Union, a body which governs itself by electing their own office bearers. The Student Union works hand in hand with the College authority with the Principal as its President. The union helps in organization of different functions and activities as well as helping out in the welfare of the students.



2. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The NSS Unit of the College has long been actively engaged in community services to the localities surrounding the campus and even spread its good work as far as the neighbouring towns and villages outside Lunglei. The NSS instills in the student volunteers a sense of social responsibility among many other benefits through social works like blood donation, planting of trees, cleanliness drive, sanitation and various other awareness programmes. The NSS works under the guidance and supervision of Programme Officers appointed from the faculty.



3. Adventure Club

IGNOU in Lunglei Gov't College

The Indira Gandhi National Open University Study Centre was started in Lunglei Govt. College in the year 1998 with an agreement signed between IGNOU authority and Principal, Lunglei Govt. College. The Study Centre code no. is 1902. The Study Centre offers different programmes of studies like Bachelors' Preparatory Programme (BPP), Bachelors' Degree Programme (BDP) viz; B.Sc, B.A, B.Com and Master of Arts in English, Political Science and History. Admission for the aforesaid programme is done twice in a year during January and July. Term End Examination is held in the month of June and December respectively. Enrolment of students is usually around 250 every year.

The Study Centre conducts exams for different programme under IGNOU like Diploma, Certificates, BPP, PBDP, B.Ed, M.Ed and M.A courses.

Co-ordinator heads the Study Centre with one Asst. Co-Ordinator and 3 other Staff in the office. The host institution provides a room for IGNOU office and store with all other essential facilities.

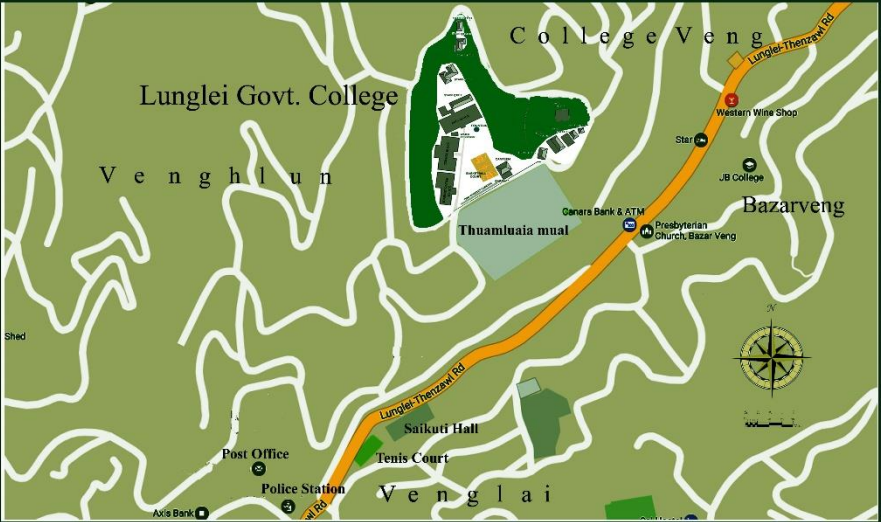

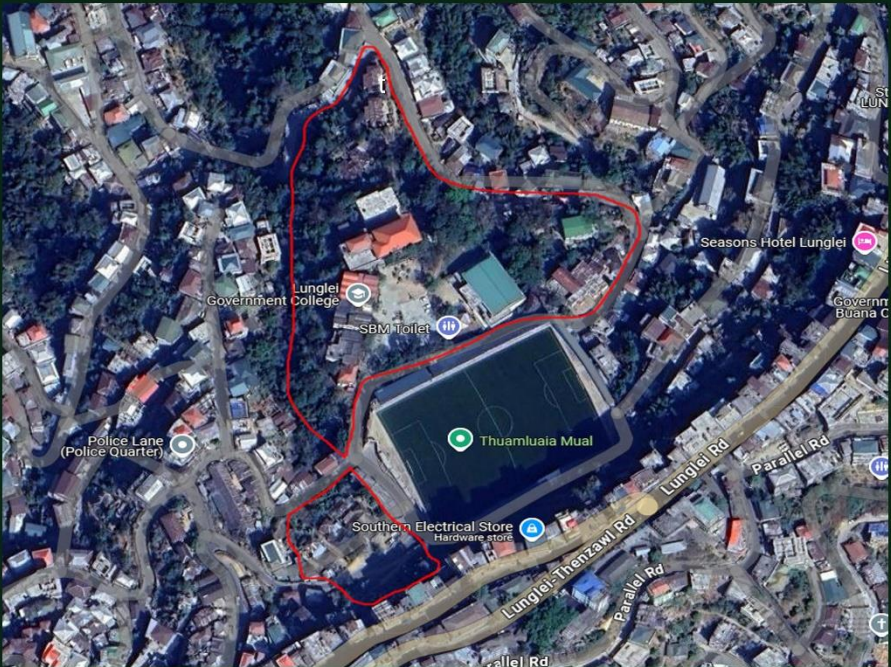
